HEAVEN CALLS— IS YOUR RINGER ON ?

Blessing and prayers to all our friends, supporters and newsletter subscribers of the Central NY Marian Center.

Do our hearts ring out with great love and joy for the **Holy Rosary**, a priceless treasure which is inspired by **God**? **Our Blessed Mother** appeared to **St. Dominic** in 1214, giving him the **Rosary** in its present form and method we use today.

October is the month of the **Holy Rosary**. One of the reasons that **Pope Leo XIII** designated it so, is the **Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary**, which falls on October 7. Like many Marian feasts, the **Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary** celebrates the protection of Christians through the **Mother of God**; and, like many feasts toward the end of the liturgical year, it commemorates a struggle with the forces of Islam.

In this case, the **Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary** celebrates the victory of Christian naval forces at the Battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571. At a time when Christian Europe was being torn apart by internal strife and the Reformation, **Don John** of Austria destroyed the Turkish fleet in the Gulf of Lepanto, the victory

was attributed to the intercession of the **Blessed Virgin Mary**, to whom rosaries were offered and processions were made in Rome on the day of the battle.

Following the great Christian victory at Lepanto, **Pope St. Pius V** declared that henceforth a commemoration of the **Rosary** would be a part of the Vatican’s Mass on every October 7. His successor, **Pope Gregory XIII**, went further. In 1573 he established the **Feast of the Most Holy Rosary** to be celebrated at all Churches which had specific altars dedicated to the **Rosary**. This feast was extended by **Pope Clement XI** to the whole of the Latin Rite, inserting it into the Roman Catholic calendar of saints in 1716, and assigning it to the first Sunday in October. **Leo XIII** has since raised the feast to the rank of a double of the second class and has added to the Litany of Loreto the invocation “**Queen of the Most Holy Rosary**”. On this feast, in every church in which the **Rosary** confraternity has been duly erected, a plenary indulgence *toties quoties* is granted upon certain conditions to all who visit therein the **Rosary** chapel or statue of **Our Lady**. This has been called the “**Portiuncula**” of the **Rosary**. **Pope Pius X**

changed the date to October 7th in 1913, as part of his effort to restore celebration of the liturgy of the Sundays.

The word Rosary means “crown of roses.” St. Louis De Montfort calls the Rosary “the mystical rose tree of **Jesus and Mary** in life, death, and eternity.” He tells us that reciting the Rosary produces spiritual roses which will “never wilt or die, and they will be just as exquisite thousands of years from now as they are today.” In regards the worth of saying the Rosary, he professes it to be a “priceless treasure which is inspired by **God**” (**The Secret of The Rosary, Montfort Publications, 1954**).

On October 13, 1917, seventy thousand pilgrims witnessed the miracle of the sun at Fatima. Just prior to noon of that same day, the Lady “more brilliant than the sun” appeared to the three children, saying, “**I am the Lady of the Rosary**. I have come to warn the faithful to amend their lives and to ask pardon for their sins. They must not offend our Lord any more, for he is already too grievously offended by the sins of men. People must say the Rosary. Let them continue saying it every day.”



Our Lady has told us, if we would fill one church with everyone praying the rosary, we would have the power to change the world!!!

Amoris Laetitia is a document by Pope Francis, an apostolic exhortation on marriage and love in the family.

Father Jason Hage will be leading an Adult Faith Formation series on Pope Francis' new work, "The Joy of Love."

Father Hage grew up in a tight-knit family that always made going to mass a priority. As a young man he rarely felt engaged by the faith, until his junior year in high school when he returned to prayer and the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

"All of a sudden, experiencing God's love for the first time personally, meaning came flooding into my life," Father Hage said. "And that meaning and purpose came from the simple fact of knowing that I am loved beyond words, I'm loved beyond my imaginings by this God."

After feeling a call to the priesthood he studied at Xavier University in Cincinnati, Ohio. There he founded a group

for young Catholics who wanted to deepen their faith.

After graduating from Xavier, Father Hage entered St. Mary's Seminary and University in Baltimore, Md., as a seminarian for the diocese. He graduated just weeks ago with a **Master of Divinity degree.**

Father Hage was ordained on June 7, 2014 by Bishop Cunningham to the Diocese of Syracuse.

Father Hage's first and current position is **Parochial Vicar** at Holy Family Church.

This Adult Faith Formation series will lead those who participate into a deeper understanding of Catholic family life and love. Regular reading and attendance is not required. Father Hage is an up and coming dynamic spokesman in the Catholic church. You and I need to attend this series. You won't want to miss it!!!
