Feast Day of St. Joseph

March 19, 2018

St. Joseph is regarded as the patron saint of workers and is associated with various feast days. Pope Pius IX declared him to be both the patron and the protector of the Catholic Church, in addition to his patronages of the sick and of a happy death.

March is the month of devotion to St. Joseph, whose feast falls on March 19th. The date of the solemnity of St. Joseph dates to the end of the 15th century; within the next few centuries, the entire month as a time for devotion to St. Joseph became part of tradition.

Saint's Amazing Miracles

As we conclude the history of the first class relics donated to the CNY Marian Center, we finish with their miracles.

St. Catherine of Siena

The Fast of St. Catherine of Siena (d. 1380) has been recorded for us by none other than one of her confessors, Bl. Raymond of Capua. The biography of St. Catherine informs us that following a vision of Our Lord, food was no longer necessary to the saint.

Saint Catherine of Siena had Visions during the consecration of the Mass, sometimes seeing Jesus dressed as a Priest, repeating the words He spoke at the Last Supper. Other times, seeing the Consecrated Host, she saw the Baby Jesus in the Priest's hands.

Priests were touched by happenings during Holy Mass with Saint Catherine of Siena. One reported he saw the Host go to her without him moving his arm. Other Priests said they saw the Host nod to her, almost as if in recognition. There were those who could feel their arms being pulled toward her, with the Host. Raymond of Capua reported he saw a Host travel clear across the church to Catherine. It was as if the Lord desired her as much as she longed for Him. There was a magnet between them and that Magnet was the Eucharist.

At the moment of receiving Communion, her face would become transfixed, as if glorified, surrounded by an aura. Catherine often went into ecstasy at that time, levitating. Her friends remained with her so they could

assist her home, as even from childhood, Catherine was always left weakened after an ecstasy.

St. Anthony of Padua

The Miracle of Tongues

St. Anthony of Padua. Endowed with great natural gifts, enjoying excellent health, a powerful voice, combined with great eloquence, an admirable delivery, a perfect knowledge of the Scriptures and theology. He, like the apostles after Pentecost, received that wonderful gift of tongues, which not only enabled him to preach even with eloquence in French and Italian, but to make himself understood by people from all parts of the world.

Dumb Animals Obey the Saint

A large pool filled with frogs, whose perpetual croaking's greatly disturbed the saint and his community. At last, wearied by this perpetual noise, he determined to put an end to it, and going to the pond, after blessing it, ordered the frogs to stop their croaking, which at once ceased, and the pond from that time was called St. Anthony's Pond.

He preached the gospel to wild animals, birds in the air and fish in the sea.

Why St. Anthony is Invoked for Lost and Mislaid Things

When we pray to St. Anthony for lost items, he restores our memory and we find what is lost.

Saint Andrew Avellino

Saint Andrew (Andrea) Avellino (1521 – November 10, 1608) was an Italian saint. Born at Castronuovo (today Castronuovo di Sant' Andrea), his baptismal name was Lancelotto, which out of love for the cross he changed into Andrew when he entered the **Order of Theatines**.

He went to Naples to study canon and civil law, obtained the degree of **Doctor of Laws** and was ordained priest at the age of twenty-six.

On November 10, 1608, when beginning the **Holy Sacrifice of the Mass**, he was stricken with apoplexy, and, after receiving the **Holy Viaticum**, died at the age of 88. As pieces of hair were cut from his head for relics, blood oozed from the skin. For years after his death, the stored vials of blood liquefied on the anniversary of his death. In 1624, only 16 years after his death, he was beatified by **Pope Urban VIII**, and in 1712 was canonized by **Pope Clement XI**.

Saint Vincent Ferrer

Saint Vincent Ferrer is one of the greatest saints of the Holy Catholic Church. Few saints have been more gifted in speech and none have performed as many miracles. In fact, it was often said that it was 'a miracle' if St. Vincent Ferrer did not perform a miracle!

St. Vincent was born in Valencia, Spain on January 23, 1350. However, even *in utero* he was performing miracles. His mother visited a blind woman she often helped. The lady placed her head on the mother's womb to hear the baby's heart beat and was instantly healed of her blindness. Before St. Vincent was three months old, Valencia was struck by a terrible famine. The infant spoke in a perfectly intelligible manner to his mother, informing her that all the townspeople needed to carry a venerated statue in procession about the city to end the famine. No sooner had the procession begun than rain began to fall and the famine was broken.

From his tenderest years, God was calling St. Vincent to serve Him at His Altar. He joined the Dominican Order and was soon teaching and preaching all over Spain. Pope Benedict XIII in turn called him to Avignon where he became the confessor for the papal court. At this time, Christendom was split between two rival popes (the Great Western Schism) and it was difficult for Christians to know who the real pope

was.

At the age of forty, sorrow over the great division led the great Dominican to the brink of death. Yet as he lay sick in bed, entrusting his final breaths to God, he received a heavenly vision. Our Lord appeared to him with St. Francis and St. Dominic at His sides. Our Lord told St. Vincent that he was entrusting him with a great mission to save His Bride from the imminent destruction of the world. St. Vincent recovered his full health.

For twenty years, St. Vincent Ferrer carried out the apostolate of a itinerant missionary preacher. Followed by a train of priests, brothers, nuns, penitents and pilgrims, that at times numbered over ten-thousand strong. Daily Mass, hours of confession, preaching, and daily prayer consumed his days. Twice a day the "Bell of Miracles" was rung, once in the morning and once in the evening. Each time all the sick and infirm were brought to him and he would cure them all. It was not all unusual for St. Vincent to perform more than one hundred bona-fide miracles in a day.

St. Vincent also had great success in preaching to the Moors and Jews. Countless converts came into the Church and on one single day he converted more than five thousand Jews. His spiritual success was even more fruitful among Catholics. Hatreds, envies, wars and other divisions were all brought to an abrupt end under his guidance. Once he raised a woman from the dead so that she could testify to all present that he was indeed the Angel of the Apocalypse (cf. Apco 14:6), sent by God to call a world seeped in sin to repentance.

The Great Western Schism was finally ended in 1417 when all the world universally acknowledged Martin V as rightful pope. St. Vincent Ferrer died in Vannes, Brittany on April 5, 1419.

After the fall she could not sleep, was forgetful and couldn't focus. She needed help. Jan-Marie and her mom prayed. She was sent to the SUNY Upstate Medical University Concussion Clinic for art therapy as an exercise to help her learn to focus. It was then that she discovered how her talents and abilities had grown. She now focuses on what God has led her to do and creates incredible inspiring spiritual portraits.

Jan-Marie says " My ability is God given. It is meant to be shared. I hope that it engages the viewer. It is meant to offer a feeling that reminds the gazer of a special time, place or person. I feel privileged and Blessed to be able to do what I do and to share it with others."

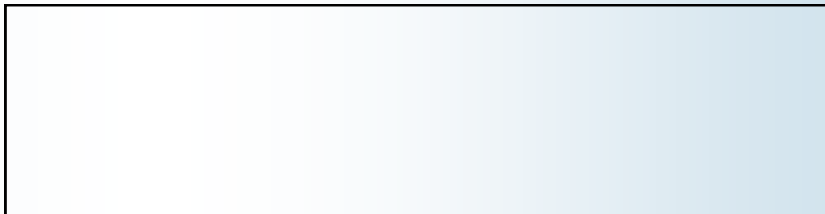
